

SURVIVAL GUIDE TO NYCXDESIGN

We are experts at navigating NYCxDESIGN so we put together a quick list of dos and don'ts. Whether you're seasoned or it's your first time, here are our tips for survival:

- 1 / Ladies, block heels or smart flats only please. ICFF is now the entire upstairs of the Javits Center, and that's a lot of aisles. Plus those cobblestone streets of Soho are notoriously unforgiving, especially after a few complimentary showroom apéritifs.
- 2 / Check the forecast. NYC weather in May is about as predictable as a wasp on speed.
- 3 / Lyft is good, but get down with Juno. The car service is wildly popular in NYC because A) You get 30% off your first two weeks of fares, B) they pay their drivers well.
- BYOS Bring Your Own Snacks. The Javits Center food situation, like most trade show locations, is very limited. Someday they will take a cue from High Point and bring in the tasty comfort food, but for now, pack your granola bars.
- Plan your route. Go a step beyond targeting which fairs you'd like to see and jot down specific booths and exhibits within that are a priority. Visit those first and take whatever time remaining to wander.
- 6 / If you're a buyer take business cards, don't give.

- Snap photos of everything that moves you. Don't think, just shoot. You can weed through it all later. Just don't forget to photograph the name of the vendor!
- Pack your charging phone case. All those photos are going to drain your juice.
- Pack a second backup charger.
- Stick around. The last day of each fair is an open market with deals to be had for cash & carry items, including large pieces of furniture if you're savvy enough to have brought a van.

IC DESIGN FESTIVAL

WantedDesign Brooklyn is now known as the IC Design Festival by WantedDesign. Developed with the same ethos of supporting emerging talent as WantedDesign Manhattan, but with a lot more space to work with, IC Design Festival is a five-day, indoor/outdoor, campus-wide celebration of design at Industry City, including a primary exhibition space at the Factory Floor. Don't miss the **Open Studios** on May 19 - 20 when over 100 artists and designers will open their studios and create work specifically for the event. Artist Camille Walala will also unveil a permanent mural wrapping the façade of one of Industry City's prominent, pre-war factories.

WANTEDDESIGN MANHATTAN May 19 - 22

Now in its 8th year, WantedDesign at the Terminal Stores is an eclectic show featuring contemporary furnishings, design, and interactive installations that pleasantly benefits from its close

proximity to the Javits Center. Don't miss the Launch Pad, a selection of work by emerging talent that is reviewed and juried by a panel of industry luminaries. Notable members of this year's jury include Marva Griffin Wilshire, founder of Salone del Mobile, Giulio Cappellini, and our very own Jaime Derringer.

ICFF 4 May 20 - 23



THE LAY OF THE LAND: NYCXDESIGN'S DESIGN DISTRICTS

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SOHO TR

The hub of NYC design, Soho Design District is the most concentrated grouping of individual furniture and lighting showrooms in the city. From Tom Dixon's new showroom on Greene to NYC flagships for Flos, Kartell, Fritz Hansen, Lee Broom, Foscarini and Cassina, there's a whole day of exploring to do o'er cobblestone streets in this picturesque design neighborhood.

TRIBECA

Ah, Tribeca. Difficult to get to, but so worth the journey. Where else can you get up close and personal with a Kaare Klint sofa from 1933 in near pristine condition? Wyeth's Tribeca outpost – that's where. We also would recommend stops at David Weeks Studio, Colony, Lambert & Fils at Montauk Sofa, Property, R&Company, Room, and last but not least, Espasso. Brazilian... so hot right now.

NOMAD

NYCxDESIGN's newest design neighborhood and proud home of the IC Design Festival by WantedDesign, Industry City in Sunset Park has emerged on the Gowanus riverbank as the raw epicenter of up-and-coming New York design. Over the last several years, Industry City's 19th century shipping warehouses have been converted into a network of showrooms, retail spaces, galleries and workshops, complete with a predictably-artisanal food hall.
